

## Urinary Symptom Questionnaire for Neurogenic Bladder-Indwelling Catheterization (USQNB-IDC)

### ACTION NEEDED (A)

- Feeling feverish
- Abdominal/ suprapubic pain
- Increased tone/ spasticity (not bladder spasms)
- Bladder spasm frequency/discomfort
- Sweating
- Flushing of the chest, neck or face
- Autonomic Dysreflexia (AD)
- Difficulty thinking, mental fogginess, forgetfulness, confusion
- Bladder discomfort

\_\_\_\_\_ **Number of Action Needed (A)-type Symptoms**

### BLADDER (B1)

- Blood in urine
- Blood clots in urine
- Urinary urgency
- Incontinence/ urine leakage

\_\_\_\_\_ **Number of Bladder (B1) - type Symptoms**

### URINE QUALITY (B2)

- Worse-smelling urine
- Darker urine
- Cloudier/sediment in urine

\_\_\_\_\_ **Number of Urine Quality (B2) - type Symptoms**

### OTHER (C)

- Discharge, redness, or sensitivity around catheter site
- Increase or decrease from your usual blood pressure
- Diarrhea
- Numbness, tingling in your extremities
- Sense of burning in the extremities or throughout the body
- Increase in fatigue, lethargy, or weakness
- Generalized abdominal discomfort or bloating
- Irritability
- Back pain
- Pain below the level of injury
